We are back at Thornden Hall as a live festival for 2022.

Over the past two years, it has been an exceedingly difficult time for everyone involved in music making and drama. Choirs have not been able to rehearse, many music and drama lessons have gone on-line. Of course, the festival itself went on-line very quickly in 2020. In 2021 we made the decision to run an on-line festival again, and this was highly successful with a good take up from performers both young and old.

However, music and drama are supposed to be live experiences, and so we are very pleased, in this our 96th year, to be able to return to a live festival. The opportunities gained by performing in front of a live audience are immeasurable, both in enjoyment and also in the confidence gained by the performer.

In 2021, four of our section administrators were awarded certificates in recognition of their years of service by Southampton Voluntary Services.

I know that with everyone's enthusiasm for this amazing event and your continued support and help, we can look forward knowing that future generations will gain as much enjoyment from the Festival as we have.

RULES AND INFORMATION

ENTRIES

- All entries must be received by 15th January 2022. Please note this date is final except in exceptional circumstances.
- The Festival Committee reserves the right to accept or reject any entry and if necessary to limit the number of entries. Once an entry is made then payment will be due which will not be refunded should the entrant subsequently withdraw.
- 3. The submission of any entry form and the acceptance thereof by the Festival Committee shall constitute a binding contract between the Committee and the entrant that these Rules will be complied with by the entrant. As these Rules have been published with the Syllabus the entrant shall be deemed to have notice of them.
- 4. Any paper entry form submitted by an entrant under 18 should be signed by a person over 18 on the entrant's behalf and the signatory shall be personally responsible for the observance of these Rules and Conditions by the entrant and shall indemnify the Committee against any loss occasioned by any non–compliance. If any entry form is signed by some other person (e.g., a teacher) on behalf of an entrant over 18 then the signatory shall be deemed to be an agent of the entrant, authorised to bind the entrant to agree to these Rules and Conditions.
- Receipt of entries: The Festival Committee cannot be held responsible for non-arrival of entries for any reason. Entrants requiring confirmation of their paper entry should enclose a stamped addressed POSTCARD with their entry form(s) listing the Classes entered.
- 6. For paper entries, payment for all classes entered must be sent with the entry form to the Chairman. For online entries, an acknowledgement will be sent by e-mail confirming the entry after payment.

LIMITATIONS ON ENTRY

- 7. A performer's age is reckoned as on 1 September 2021. Entrants in Classes where there is an age limit may be called upon to prove their age by production of a birth certificate. Adult Classes are for 19 years and above.
- Entrants may not enter more than ONE age group and/or ONE grade Class within a Section. They may, if they wish, enter a Class higher than their own age group or grade but this will debar them from entering their own age group or grade Class.
- In Ensemble Classes, including Duets, Trios and Quartets, individual performers may enter more than one Class provided that no group contains more than one third of those members appearing together in another named group.

IN GENERAL

10. The Festival is mainly intended for amateurs, but professionals are invited to enter the Adult OPEN Classes. For the purpose of this Festival, a professional is defined in relation to each individual Class in the Syllabus as a person whose main occupation is in teaching or performing the subject covered by that particular class.

- 11. The Adjudicator's decision is final. All complaints, protests or representations on other matters must be made IN WRITING to the Festival Chairman and the decision of the Chairman, in consultation with the Officers and/or Section Administrators shall be final.
 - 12. The Chairman and the Festival Committee reserve the right to qualify or determine any of the general regulations as circumstances may require.
- 13. In order to maintain the smooth running of each class, it would be appreciated if entrants wishing to withdraw from one or more Classes would communicate with the appropriate Section Administrator in advance.
- Any entrant not present at the appointed time will be debarred from competing unless valid reasons are given. The decision of the Section Administrator is final.
- 15. <u>Normally competitors should not perform a piece</u> that they have performed in the previous two years. However, we are waiving this requirement this year.
- Entrants are advised to order set pieces early. If any difficulty is experienced, please contact the appropriate Section Administrator.

OWN CHOICE CLASSES

17. All adult music performers must declare their 'own choice' pieces at the time of entry, or not later than 15th January 2022. Details of Own Choice pieces for all Adult classes will be printed in the Programme.

For all other Own Choice Classes details of pieces do **not** need to be declared in advance. Own Choice Classes, which must be declared in advance and those, which may be announced on the day are identified in lists at the start of each Music Section. Entrants in the Adult and Junior Vocal Sections should read the note in the preamble to their section concerning the Official Accompanist.

- 18. Entrants must provide a copy (which may be a photocopy see Rule 26) of the music for all Own Choice Pieces for the Adjudicator's use. The original printed copy and, if provided, the photocopy, MUST be presented to the Section Administrator before the commencement of the Class.
- 19. Where time limits are shown, they include the time taken for presentation, where applicable, but not for tuning.
- 20. In fairness to other entrants, the Committee reserves the right to impose penalties for exceeding the time limit in Own Choice Classes. Entrants could be disqualified, marked down a grade, barred from winning a cup or trophy or have their performance stopped by the Section Administrator or Adjudicator for a time limit infringement.









CUPS, TROPHIES AND PLACINGS

21. Entrants will only be eligible for the award of Cups and Trophies if they receive Commended, Distinction or Honours. The cups for Children's Ensemble Workshops are awarded at the Adjudicator's discretion.

- 22. The winners will hold the Cups or Trophies for a year and are responsible for their safe custody and for insurance at their own expense. In the event of loss or damage for any reason whatsoever, the holder will be responsible for the cost of replacement or repair and should take all necessary steps to obtain indemnity from their insurers.
- 23. The holders will be responsible for engraving names, etc and must obtain the Festival Committee's approval for any engraving which does not follow the established pattern and style indicated by previous engraving. Cups and Trophies must be returned to the Section Administrator by the 1st February before the next Festival unless other arrangements have been agreed and confirmed by correspondence.
- In the event of any Cup or Trophy being won by an entrant under 18, the Section Administrator will require acceptance of personal responsibility for the observance of these conditions by a person over 18 years of age, before presenting the Cup or Trophy and may withhold it if no person is available to assume such responsibility on behalf of the winner.
- 25. Normally a first, second and third place will be announced by the Adjudicator in all classes. However, in classes where there are only a small number of competitors, the Adjudicator may use his/her discretion to award only a first and second place or only a first place.

COPYRIGHT AND PHOTOCOPIES

- 26. The Festival cannot legally allow anyone to perform from photocopies of copyright works and has no choice but to disqualify performers and accompanists who do so. The only photocopies the Festival can allow are:
 - (i) copies for the Adjudicator's use, which will be destroyed at the end of each Class.
 - (ii) for an awkward page-turn which may hinder a performance. In this instance, the performer/ accompanist must show the original printed copy and the photocopied page to the Section Administrator before the Class begins and receive agreement to its use.
 - (iii) those where the publisher's permission has been sought and given and written evidence to that effect is shown to, and accepted by, the Section Administrator before the Class starts.
 - (iv) those that comply with the current copyright laws.

PLEASE NOTE: The Southampton Festival has entered into an agreement with the Authors' Licensing and Collecting Society, whereby entrants do not have to seek copyright permission for any POETRY, PROSE or SOLO DRAMATIC ITEMS performed. For this agreement to be effective, entrants MUST give FULL DETAILS of the excerpts chosen before the performance, that is TITLE, AUTHOR and PUBLISHER, otherwise entrants will have to make their own arrangements with the copyright agents. Copyright now lasts for 70 years from the death of the author. (Entry fees now include 5p to cover the annual cost of this agreement).

IMPORTANT NOTICE - Any entrant who submits an entry in DUOLOGUE OR ACTED SCENE CLASSES need to make sure that they have the fulfilled the relevant copywrite permissions. Scenes may be written by the teachers or competitors themselves.

27. Entrants in the Adult and Junior Vocal Sections should read the note in the preamble to their section concerning the Official Accompanist.

USE OF RECORDING DEVICES (Video or Audio Equipment)

- 28. The Festival is advised by the British and International Federation of Festivals that, for copyright and performing right reasons, the use of recording devices such as video cameras, tape/CD recorders, by the audience is not permitted.
- Still photography is not allowed during performances, although parents may photograph cup and trophy presentations to their own children.

CD BACKING TRACKS

With the exception of all School Choir classes (119-128),
 623-624 (strings) , 650-659 (guitar), 720-723 (instrumental), 780-791 (percussion) 942-952 (Drama),
 no CD Backing Tracks are allowed as an accompaniment for live classes.

AMPLIFICATION

31. The use of electronic means of amplification to boost a performance (other than those microphones used by the Festival's sound engineer in the auditorium) is not allowed. However, instruments such as amplified guitars are permissible within certain ensembles e.g., jazz groups, where it is considered conventional and appropriate. In addition, classes 650-659 which feature the use of microphones. Please refer any queries to the appropriate Section Administrator.

REQUIREMENTS FOR PIANO ACCOMPANIMENT IN THE BRASS, RECORDER, STRING AND WOODWIND SECTIONS

PLEASE NOTE: All SOLOS must be played with PIANO ACCOMPANIMENT except when a piece is written expressly for the unaccompanied instrument, or a study is offered. Competitors not conforming to this rule will be disqualified. THE OFFICIAL ACCOMPANIST MAY BE AVAILABLE FOR ALL SECTIONS THIS YEAR. Competitors are advised to arrange an accompanist at the time of entry. Performers having difficulty in providing an accompanist should contact the appropriate Section Administrator.

Adjudicators' Biographies

Pooja Agra – Indian and World Music

Pooja Angra has held workshops and presentations at schools, colleges and Secondary Teacher Training groups and performs at various places in the U.K. She is currently working on several music projects for Southampton Music Services and Art Asia. She is an accredited performing artiste (All India Radio) - in Jalandhar since 1991, as well as Doordarshan Television Centre (Indian national television channel).

Pooja won first prize in the National group song competition organised by Bharat Vikas Parishad for the years 1994, 1995, 1996 and 1998 respectively and participated in Christmas Carol singing in the annual function Christ King Convent School in 1993. She was declared Best Singer of the College for the year 1999-2000 (H.M.V College, Jalandhar, Punjab, India) and has won many first prizes and certificates of merit during her school and college years, becoming Head Girl of College for the year 1998. Pooja has conducted college functions and compered cultural programmes and the International Classical Music Festival Shree Baba Harivallabh Sangeet Sammelan, in December 2002.

Timothy Barratt - Piano

Timothy studied on a scholarship at the Royal Academy of Music and in Paris with Vlado Perlemuter. As well as performing as solo pianist, accompanist and chamber music player he has considerable experience of teaching at all levels.

He was a lecturer and vocal coach at the RAM and TCL for many years and was also Head of Keyboard at Dulwich College and a teacher at the Junior Academy.

He adjudicates for The British and International Federation of Festivals, directs workshops for teachers in the UK and abroad and is an ABRSM examiner, trainer, moderator and presenter, and a mentor for the Certificate of Teaching

Julia Dewhurst – Choirs, Adult & Junior Vocal

A lyric-coloratura soprano, Julia Dewhurst's ongoing performing career has encompassed opera, concert and recital repertoire from Early Music to first performances of contemporary works. She has broadcast for BBC TV and Radio and has appeared in many of the country's leading concert venues. Abroad, she has undertaken engagements in Germany, France, Spain, Holland, the Middle East and the Seychelles where she gave concerts and masterclasses in the Seychelles Festival of Classical Music.

On the opera stage she has appeared with the Royal Opera, ENO, Kent Opera, English Touring Opera, Pavilion Opera, European Chamber Opera, Opera East, London Opera Players and The Garden Opera Company. Her roles have included Susanna and the Countess (*The Marriage of Figaro*), Queen of the Night, Pamina and First Lady (*The Magic Flute*), Gilda (*Rigoletto*), Donna Anna (*Don Giovanni*), Micaela (*Carmen*), Despina (*Cosi fan Tutte*), Constanza (*Die Entfuhrung*), Norina (*Don Pasquale*), Miss Wordsworth (*Albert Herring*) Loelia in the premiere of Donald Swann's comic opera *The Man with the Thousand Faces*, and many of the Gilbert & Sullivan soprano roles

Julia has extensive teaching experience across the entire age range. She was for many years a visiting singing specialist in a London primary school working at Foundation, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 levels and leading voice care workshops for teachers. Although her own career has been primarily centred on Classical repertoire, Julia has a deep interest in all vocal genres from Rock and Pop to Jazz and Music Theatre. She enjoys working with singers on the techniques underpinning voice production and on helping them to discover their own distinctive vocal personalities in performance.

She has been a much sought-after adjudicator for the British and International Federation of Festivals for more than 20 years. She is a member of the Incorporated Society of Musicians, the Association of Teachers of Singing, the British Voice Association, the Association of English Singers and Speakers, for whom she has judged both the Patricia Routledge Competition and the Courtney Kenny Award and she is a Friend of the Society of Teachers of the Alexander Technique.

Susy Hague – Speech & Drama

Susy Hague was born in Montreal in Canada. Her father was Swiss and her mother a British singer on BBC Radio, hence Susy's love of the arts. Returning to this country at the age of 5, she was educated, firstly in London and then at Holy Family Convent, Littlehampton. After completing her O Levels, Susie studied for two years at Roehampton and qualified with honours at the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art. She has taught Speech and Drama for many years at numerous schools and colleges with pupils of all ages, from 4 to 100 years of age. Susy has produced numerous school and amateur dramatic productions, adjudicated in this country and abroad and is a LAMDA Examiner. She speaks French and some Spanish and was also a Beaver Scout Leader for 5 years. Susy loves the theatre, travel, sport and plays tennis.

Gillian Johnston – Orchestras, Percussion, Brass & Woodwind.

Gillian studied the bassoon with Archie Camden at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama and, after a period of freelance playing, concentrated on a teaching career, before moving to Harpenden where she established her own Music School, 'Harpenden Musicale.'

As well as running the Music School, Gill arranges Musicale Holidays, Competitions and a Summer Music Festival. She is the founder and Musical Director of the National Children's Wind Orchestra and associated groups. Gill is an adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals and very much enjoys contact with young musicians, inspiring and enthusing their interest in music.

The Alban Rees-Jones Award

SPECIAL AWARD - Alban Rees-Jones died on 4th January 2015. He was regarded as one of the finest accompanists and organists in the South of England and gave long and distinguished service to many organisations in Southampton. His playing was meticulously accurate and he coaxed exquisite detail from piano and organ keyboards and was much in demand as an accompanist for the Southampton Choral Society, the Conchord Singers, the St Mary's Singers from Cowes, and many other choirs. He was a regular accompanist to many students at Southampton University, and a highly respected organ tutor and the university's illustrious Cantores Michaelis worked with him regularly. The musical life of the city is poorer with his passing.

The Southampton Choral Society has given a cup to the Piano Section of the Festival which will be engraved <u>'The Alban Rees-Jones Cup'</u>. There will also be a <u>Monetary Award of £150-200</u> in his name to be given at the discretion of the Adjudicator to someone from any of the Junior Piano Classes, showing great promise, in order to further their music studies and that person could be invited to play a short piece at one of the Choral Society's concerts.

Alban was passionate about many things, ranging from his beloved Elgar, Parry and Finzi to the Somerset, Hampshire and England cricket teams and Southampton's football team. He was also very keen to encourage young musical talent and for this year the cup will be awarded to the best performance in Class 403.
